Macedon Ranges community engagement

Values-based engagement program from August 2022 to March 2023 across the Macedon Ranges

Community identified 10 priority areas including:

- Healthy waterways and habitats
- Safe drinking water
- Appropriate access to water for everyone

These community perspectives directly informed the potential future opportunities presented to the community for Romsey





Romsey Recycled Water Plant Upgrade

- Inlet works upgrade
- Winter storage expansion
- Lagoon upgrades and remediation
- Recycled water pump station upgrade
- Electrical and instrumentation upgrade
- Construction of a biosolids sludge drying pad





Romsey Recycled Water Plant Upgrade Engagement activities

Face to face community engagement and online consultation via our YourSay page was open for six weeks from 16 June to 31 July

- Community bulletin emailed to ~ 2,400 customers
- Drop-ins at Romsey Neighbourhood House on Saturday 17 June and Tuesday 20 June 2024
- Lancefield and Riddells Creek farmers' markets;
 Saturday 17 June and Saturday 24 June
- Pop-up sausage sizzle with Lions at Romsey IGA on Sunday 23 July 2023
- Letterbox drop across Romsey and Lancefield to 2,500 properties

New water filtration technology

We're trialling new recycled water filtration technology

Additional feedback was sought on these potential opportunities on improving community outcomes in line with values identified by the community

- Parks and gardens
- Farming

- Natural water filtration stormwater and recycled water
- Many environmental benefits



Community response

A strong community response was received:

- •1,149 views of the YourSay page
- •Approximately 140 conversations with the local community at the pop up and drop-in sessions
- •The community know the upgrade is needed and are supportive
- •The community was most supportive of GWW exploring biodiversity opportunities and new wetlands



Next steps

- Our project teams are undertaking further assessments on delivering an additional winter storage at the plant. This would increase the plant's storage space and support the region's growing population
- We will keep you updated on the results of this assessment
- These assessments have delayed our submission to the EPA for a Development Licence at the Romsey RWP
- We anticipate the application to be submitted by February 2024 and will provide a full engagement report to the community at this time
- The project is still on track for construction to begin in November 2024.
